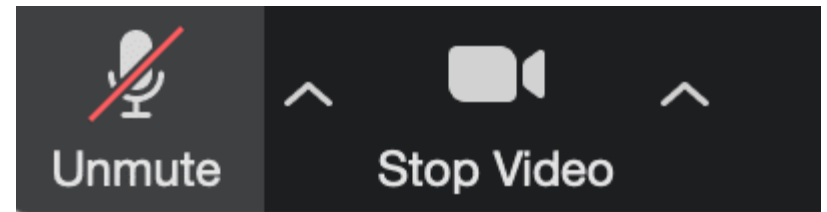

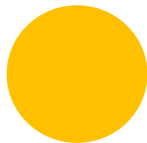

## Context and purpose of workshop

### Context:

- Diverse human rights and environmental harms of companies across value chains
- Lack of (but developing...) strong binding regulation / accountability

- Discuss & strategise how the Guidelines could be an **additional tool** for your work



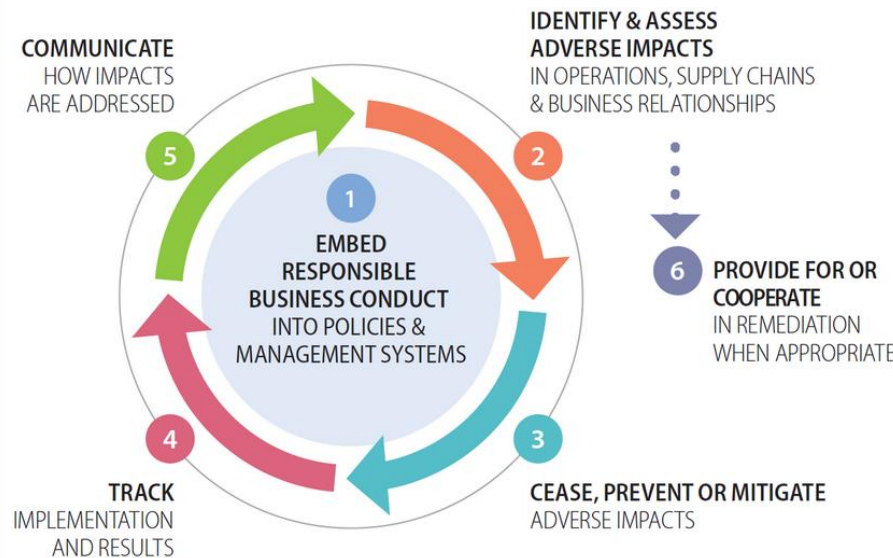


## What are the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises on Responsible Business Conduct?

- Recommendations from OECD governments to companies on how to act responsibly
- Non-binding (voluntary) standards for responsible business conduct – broad issue and value chain coverage
- Governments that follow the Guidelines must establish a body called a National Contact Point (NCP) to promote the Guidelines and handle (non-judicial) complaints
- Updated in June 2023

## What do the Guidelines say on due diligence?

- Follow OECD's six-step due diligence process
- Identify and prevent or mitigate potential harms to **people and planet**, and stop and remedy harms that have occurred
- Prevent **future harm**, and remediate past harm
- Address impacts (from business relationships) across **whole value chain**





## What do the Guidelines say on due diligence?



- Address distinct and intersecting risks to **vulnerable or marginalised groups**
- Ensure **meaningful stakeholder engagement**
- Address risks from misuse, individuals
- Enhanced due diligence in conflict settings

# Strengths & weaknesses



## Strengths

- Due diligence guidance reflected in Guidelines
- Clarified up and downstream scope
- Clarified remedy responsibilities C/C/DL
- MSIs don't replace company's own DD
- Covers individuals, misuse
- Covers tech chapter

## Weaknesses

- Due diligence expectations still not applied to Taxation and Competition chapters
