




Context and purpose of workshop

Context:

- Working on promoting good animal welfare & exposing inhumane treatment of animals
- Lack of strong binding regulation / accountability

Purpose:

 Discuss & strategise how the Guidelines could be an additional tool for your work





What are the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises on Responsible Business Conduct?

- Recommendations from OECD governments to companies on how to act responsibly
- Non-binding (voluntary) standards for responsible business conduct – broad issue and value chain coverage
- Governments that follow the Guidelines must establish a body called a National Contact Point (NCP) to promote the Guidelines and handle (non-judicial) complaints
- Updated in June 2023



What do the Guidelines say on animal welfare?



- Respect animal welfare standards consistent with World Organisation for Animal Health Terrestrial Code
- Good welfare = healthy, comfortable, well nourished, safe; not suffering from pain, fear, distress; able to express behaviours important for physical and mental state

What do the Guidelines say on animal welfare?



- Disease prevention, appropriate veterinary care, shelter, management, and nutrition
- Stimulating and safe environment for animals
- Ensure humane handling and slaughter/killing
- Adhere to guidance on transport of live animals

Strengths & weaknesses



Strengths

 Inclusion of animal welfare in text of the Guidelines (previously not mentioned)

Weaknesses:

- Animal welfare not listed under (non-exhaustive) list of environmental harms
- Lack of explicit reference to due diligence to address impacts to animal welfare (but implied)
