
Context and purpose of workshop

Context:

- Current weak policy and legislative framework on responsible business conduct
- Growing focus on RBC at state level (laws, policies)

Purpose:

 Discuss & strategise how the Guidelines could be an additional tool for your work





What are the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises on Responsible Business Conduct?

- Recommendations from OECD governments to companies on how to act responsibly
- Non-binding (voluntary) standards for responsible business conduct – broad issue and value chain coverage
- Governments that follow the Guidelines must establish a body called a National Contact Point (NCP) to promote the Guidelines and handle (non-judicial) complaints
- Updated in June 2023

The Guidelines as a tool for policy coherence?



POLICY COHERENCE



- Preface: role of government in promoting RBC, policy coherence & smart mix
- OECD Recommendation and Declaration on coherent legal frameworks
- GLs and due diligence guidance can be/already referenced in laws, bills
- Standards applicable to other policy: export credits, procurement, etc.

Declaration





Strengths

- Strong standards
- Broad scope (issues, sectors, value chain)
- Wide government & OECD backing

Weaknesses

- Standards not necessarily strongest / constrain future progress?
- Preface has only weak reference to alignment with Guidelines
- Concerns about due diligence model
